Course Overview

The Individualized Learning Program (ILP) is a student-centered program in which students work on their high school academic requirements in an online/small group setting. Students choose what to work on, when to work on it, and what pace they would like to work at. Successful students are those that are self-motivated, attend class regularly, and can stay on task while prioritizing assignments.

Course Materials

Bring what you need to learn (i.e. paper, pencils, note cards, etc.). A device with Internet access at home is highly recommended.

Public Library Card

We have a small class library, but our resources are limited. It is highly recommended that you get a public library card. All English classes are required to read books as part of the curriculum. With Covid-19, access to the class library and the classroom will not be guaranteed. A library card will expand your access to books and provide an alternative to get books in the event that schools close. Most libraries have a fantastic selection of online books. No need to make a trip to the library or worry about late fees if you use electronic library resources.

Course Goals and Objectives

- To provide students with the skills to obtain mastery of the common core standards in the subjects of English, and social studies.
- To prepare students for life after high school.
- To teach students to be independent, proactive, life-long learners by reinforcing leadership, time management, and self advocacy skills.

Expectations and Procedures

- Students are expected to remain on task at all times. This is not time to play games or watch videos. Listening to music is permitted at the teacher's discretion as long as the student is working and has headphones.
- Students will work individually or in small groups on the online platform on assignments, quizzes, projects, etc.
- Students are allowed one retake on most quizzes. Opportunities to redo failed assignments will be given as needed.
- Students wishing to work at an accelerated pace must be current on all of their ILP courses before they can be moved to the next level (i.e. no skipping English for the entire year).
- Students are permitted to use the bathroom, go to lockers, etc. one at a time. Students must sign out on the class sign out sheet prior to leaving the room.

Attendance

Attendance is mandatory! Students are expected to be in the ILP classroom during the class periods that they are scheduled to have ILP. Chronic absences may result in being removed from the ILP program. Failure to attend class is the number one reason why students are not successful in ILP. Exceptions will be given for Covid-19 and other illnesses.

Plagiarism

Plagiarism will not be tolerated. Students are expected to use their own words and cite sources where appropriate. A reduction of 50% will be given on a student's grade as a first warning. If a student continues to plagiarize, they will receive a zero on any subsequent plagiarized assignments.

Homework

Working at home is highly recommended, especially if a student falls behind. However, most of our students are able to get most of their work done if they work hard during class.

Grading and Deadlines

All work for current term classes is due by the end of the term. It is recommended that students complete coursework *before* the term deadline. Extensions will only be given if there is an extenuating circumstance that prevents a student from finishing the class on time. Students who are failing classes will be dropped from that term of the class after the term deadline. Any failing grades will be counted as missing credit and the student will be required to do credit recovery in order to graduate. Failing too many ILP classes will result in being pulled from the ILP program at the end of the term.

Term Deadlines (TBA)

Term deadlines will be posted as soon as Salt Lake City School District releases the 2020-2021 year calendar.

Grade Entry

When a student finishes a course, their grade is entered on a certificate that is submitted to the front office. Our office staff will enter the grade onto the student's transcript. Note: This process may take several days.
